## **Year One Geography – Summer One**

This term, we will be focusing on human and physical geography linked to ports, harbours, beaches, rivers and oceans.

### **National Curriculum Objective:**

- To develop an understanding of the Earth's key physical and human processes.
- To define physical and human characteristics and how these provide a geographical context for understanding the actions of processes.
- To use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including beach, coast, sea, ocean, river, season and weather.

### **Geographical core knowledge we will be working towards gaining:**

- To develop geographical knowledge and vocabulary related to key physical and human features.
- To be able to research and describe key aspects of beach, coast, sea, ocean, harbour, port as well as seasons and weather patterns.
- To develop effective questioning skills and critical thinking to extend knowledge and understanding about human and physical features.

### **Geographical skills and knowledge we will be working towards gaining:**

- Discuss how human features like houses, roads and bridges are things that have been built by people.
- Explore and investigate some human features in more detail. Port - is a place for ships to load and unload goods. Ports are also, where passengers get on and off ships. Harbour - is a sheltered area of water where boats, barges or ships are kept.
- Discuss how a bay is where there are many private boats docked.
- Explore what harbours are made of.
- Identify the difference between a river, the sea and an ocean.
- Write a report or chart showing the different human and physical features of the local area.
- Create a poster showing the human and physical feature of the seaside.
